

Summary of Audit Information

As a Pre-qualified Supplier under the User Choice program, Evocca Workplace Training is required to publish audit information in relation to its compliance with the Standards for Registered Training Organisations (RTOs) 2015. The User Choice program provides public funding paid directly to Pre-qualified Suppliers for the delivery of accredited training. The Standards ensure nationally consistent, high-quality training, and assessments across Australia's vocational education and training (VET) system. An audit reviews evidence of an organisations' compliance with the Standards to confirm that it is achieving quality training and assessment outcomes. The process also identifies opportunities for improvement on these outcomes. This information is published to assist students and their employers to make informed decisions regarding their selection of a Pre-qualified Supplier for the delivery of training and assessment services.
